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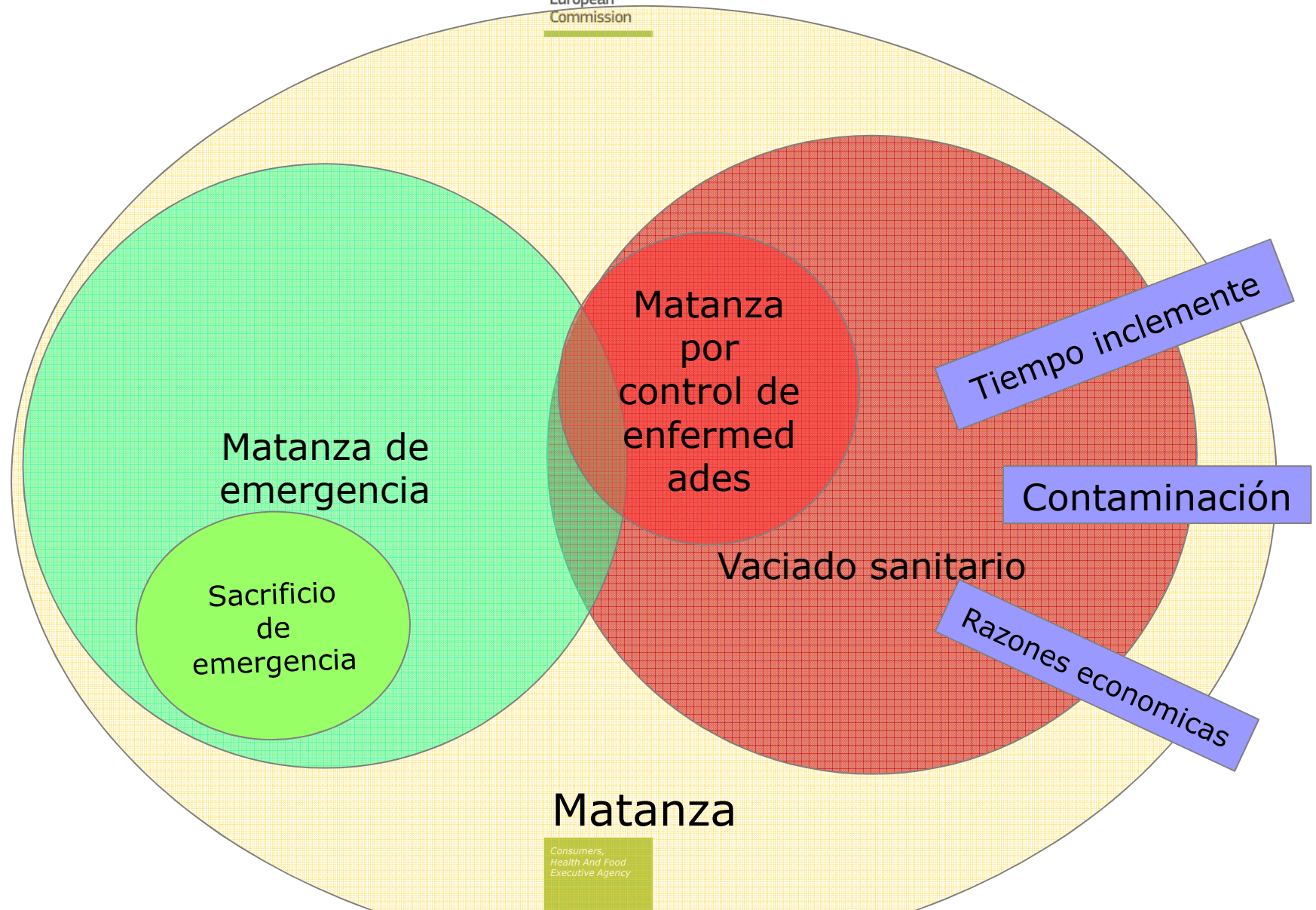

- **Matanza de emergencia:** matanza de animales heridos o afectados por una enfermedad que conlleve un intenso dolor o sufrimiento cuando no exista otra posibilidad práctica de aliviarlos;
- **Vaciado sanitario:** proceso de matanza de animales por motivos de salud pública, salud animal, bienestar animal o medio ambiente bajo la supervisión de la autoridad competente;



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Reglamento 1099/2009 – Vaciado Sanitario

- Establecer un plan de acción, antes del inicio de la operación, para garantizar el cumplimiento de las normas establecidas en el presente Reglamento
- Adoptar cuantas medidas sean adecuadas para preservar el bienestar de los animales en las mejores condiciones posibles
- Los planes de contingencia necesarios bajo la ley de la UE sobre salud animal deben incluir:
 - Métodos de aturdimiento y sacrificio
 - Procedimientos Normalizados de Trabajo
 - Hipótesis sobre el tamaño/ ubicación de sospecha de focos

Reglamento 1099/2009 – Vaciado Sanitario

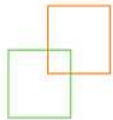
- Los planes de contingencia pueden incluir guías para desarrollar el plan de acción
- El plan de acción debe incluir detalles específicos del brote
 - Plazo y tasas de matanza
 - Demandas de recursos (por ejemplo, el número de empleados, equipos, etc.)

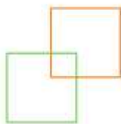
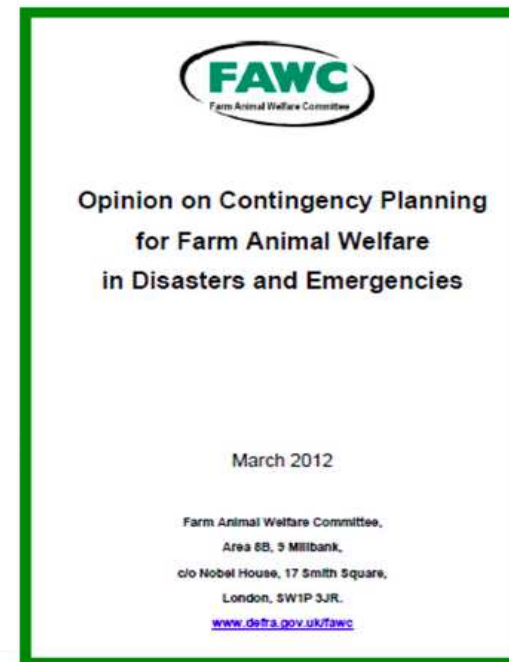

- En circunstancias excepcionales, la autoridad competente podrá conceder excepciones respecto a una o varias disposiciones del presente Reglamento cuando considere que su cumplimiento puede:
 - afectar a la salud humana o
 - ralentizar considerablemente el proceso de eradicación de una enfermedad.

Reglamento 1099/2009 – Vaciado Sanitario

- Incluir:
 - razones del vaciado sanitario
 - número y especies afectadas
 - métodos de aturdido y matanza utilizados
 - descripción de las dificultades encontradas y, en su caso, de las soluciones aplicadas para aliviar ó reducir al mínimo el sufrimiento de los animales afectados;
 - cualquier excepción concedida.



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Introduction

An essential part of all livestock systems is the effective, safe and humane handling of animals.

These guidance notes concentrate on the handling of animals in markets, during loading and unloading for transport and up to the point of slaughter. However, the same principles are also applicable to on-farm movements. During transport, at markets and slaughter, animals are handled by unfamiliar stockmen in unfamiliar environments. Under these circumstances even normally calm animals can become stressed and agitated, making them more difficult to handle than usual. This guide focuses mainly on cattle, sheep and pigs but can also be applied to other commonly farmed animals.

This guide explains the methods available for moving various species, how facilities should be set up and maintained, and highlights the associated animal welfare and operator safety implications. In addition to reading these notes, it is recommended that instruction and training is sought from qualified and experienced livestock handlers. It is also recommended that newly-trained operators work under experienced supervision.

Everyone involved with the handling of livestock has a responsibility for the wellbeing of the animals in their care. All livestock handlers
